This two-day workshop will explore the parallel development of early Ibāḍī and Shi'ī Law and Jurisprudence, aiming to open the door, probably for the first time, to an informed debate on interaction, commonalities and differences between these two important branches of Islam. The workshop will facilitate interactive dialogue among experts of both Ibadism and Shiism in order to discuss legal sources and their authenticity in an effort to further the understanding of early Islamic juridical and theological thought.

The workshop provides an opportunity for emerging and senior scholars to mix and network, and for scholars working on the two legal traditions to explore the diversity of the Islamic law. The workshop has an informal format of text-based study, presentations and discussions - with presenters leading the group through Ibāḍī and Shiʿī sources and cases, focusing on Arabic texts.

Contextualizing Ibadism and Shiism within the formation of Islam as a world religion is an urgent challenge, and one that is taken up in this workshop with regard to early sources and <code>hadīth</code> literature. It will provide with a unique opportunity to explore together some aspects of Ibadī,

Twelver Shi'ī and Zaydī law, thus abandoning the typical habit of viewing Islam "from the center," that is, focusing mainly on Sunnī sources.
